Horseshoe crabs are amazing creatures that live near the coast. Even though they're called crabs, they are more like spiders or scorpions. These unique animals have been around for a very long time, even before dinosaurs lived. People often call them "living fossils" because the way their bodies grow has stayed the same for millions of years.

Horseshoe crabs have a hard shell that looks like a horseshoe, giving them their name. This shell works like armor, protecting their body. As horseshoe crabs grow, their bodies need more space, so they take off their old shell and get a new, larger one – this is called molting. Many horseshoe crabs can continue to live and molt for 20 years.

Another interesting thing about horseshoe crabs is their special blue blood. This blue blood contains a useful material. Scientists use this special material to test medicines for safety. It's like the horseshoe crab is helping to keep people healthy!

Horseshoe crabs look quite scary. They are a little spiky and have a long, sharp tail, but actually, they don't sting; they use their tails to flip over if they're upside down. Horseshoe crabs are gentle sea creatures. They don't fight or hunt but eat small things in the sand and mud, like worms and tiny animals.

During the spring and early summer, female horseshoe crabs come to the beach to lay their eggs in the sand. The females dig a nest and put in thousands of eggs. The eggs stay there for several weeks, until tiny babies come out. Sometimes though, their eggs are eaten by sea birds.

Understanding and protecting horseshoe crabs is important if we want to look after coastal areas. This is because so many birds use their eggs as food. When there are more sea birds in an area the whole eco-system will be better.

From their useful and amazing blood to their important place in nature, the horseshoe crab is a scary-looking but friendly and helpful creature that has been around for millions of years.

Colors make our world more interesting, and one popular color is red. But did you ever think about where the red paint on your walls, in your lipstick and in some of your clothes came from?

More than 2000 years ago, people found a surprising way to make red: tiny insects called cochineal. These little bugs live on cactus plants in places like Central and

South America. The Aztecs and Incas were some of the first people to find out that by heating and then crushing these insects, they could make a bright red color.

Cochineal insects became so useful and valuable that they were eventually taken to all different parts of the world. The red color from these insects was valued for coloring clothing and also for making paints. The color that crushing cochineal makes is called carmine and it has been used in paint for hundreds of years.

Even today, cochineal powder is used in some red paints and dyes but is most often used in make-up and foods. In fact, you have probably eaten cochineal without even knowing it.

Cochineal red can be found in red-colored candy, in some fruit juices and yogurts as well as other things such as strawberry jam. Even though the idea of eating insects might sound strange or even bad, cochineal extract is safe and has been used in food for a long time.

The story of cochineal insects and their use in clothes, paint and food coloring is a reminder that everything in the world has a story. What to us is just a nice color actually has a long and interesting history. So, the next time you see a bright red wall or enjoy some sliced ham, think about the tiny cochineal insect which came all the way from cacti in South America to put more colour into your day.
